Administration: Preparing for an Insurance Services Office Visit, Par

Learning Objective: The student will be able to identify the key points to consider when preparing for an Insurance Services Office visit.

A community will often inquire as to how it can best prepare for an Insurance Services Office visit, but most of the time, the community is already better prepared for a survey than it may believe. In any event, the preparation often does not take a large amount of time or resources.

The following is a continuation of the list of items that Insurance Services Office will review when we visit your fire department.

- Deployment analysis.
 - Use of Standards of Cover analysis according to National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1710, Standard for the Organization and Deployment of Fire Suppression Operations, Emergency Medical Operations, and Special Operations to the Public by Career Fire Departments. If NFPA 1710 data is not available, we may use as an option our 1 1/2- and 2 1/2-mile distribution study.
- Any Geographic Information System files or maps in electronic format that you may have for fire stations, water systems or hydrant locations.
 - Accepted example:
 - Shape files.
- Community risk reduction.
 - Fire prevention activity.
 - Current code, inspection activity and inspectors.
 - Public fire safety education.
 - In schools, in high-risk areas, and community outreach.
 - Fire investigation.
 - Who does the investigation?
 - Use of the National Fire Incident Reporting System.
- If the fire department has a hydrant flow test program, data according to NFPA or the American Water Works Association.
 - Flow data from the tested hydrants, including:
 - Location and the result of the static and residual reading in pounds per square inch (psi).
 - Provide what size orifice the flow came from.
 - Location and the result of the pitot reading in psi.
- Computerized hydraulic modeling, if applicable.
